KMI has been providing Visual Information/Multimedia Services to Keesler AFB customers since 1992. We perform all tasks under the Visual Information umbrella to include location, studio, alert and medical photography. Our photographers have been significant contributors to the Keesler Newspaper receiving numerous AETC Command Level and Air Force Level Awards. Being one of the largest full-service multimedia contracts in the Air Force, KMI develops and produces unique one-of-a-kind graphics, from simple Vu-graphs to complex Military Fine Art to complex models and devices used for training purposes at Keesler AFB. Our Graphics Art department has set the standard for the Air Education & Training Command for Publication Art according to publishers at Maxwell AFB, AL for the past six years. KMI has a full time Graphic Illustrator assigned to work with the 81 TRSS Instructional Technology Unit, TSUI for the purpose of developing and producing IMI and Air Force Qualification Training Packages. Our

Illustrator assists in integrating text, sound, graphics, still photos and full motion video into a digital interactive multimedia program or an Air Force Qualification Training Package (OTP), They also render custom computer graphics, drawings, including threedimensional (3D) designs and 3D animation and simulation. This contract award was under the A-76 process for the TRADOC Army Command. We provide detailed and final design and fabrication of two and three-dimensional TADSS designed to represent operational equipment, components, procedures or processes. We design and fabricate scaled replicas of land, road and water terrain. The Devices Section is also responsible for repair, refurbishment and modification of existing and fabricated TADSS, displays, exhibits and instructional support items, to include podiums, platforms and work surfaces.

We provide for the acquisition, storage, safeguarding and disposition of TADSS products and equipment, to include, but not limited to: property control-receipting for loan, hand-receipt updating, requirements determination and issue of Graphic Training Aids (GTAs); warehousing, loaning, and maintenance of training aids, dummies, and Multiple Integrated Laser Engagement System (MILES) equipment; instructional services (instruction in the operation and operator's maintenance of equipment). The Fort Knox Training Support Center is the primary hand receipt holder for a 7 state regional property book of over 600 sub-hand receipts of training devices and other property that totals over \$175 million dollars. Our proprietary software allows for up to the minute viewing and management of all the item records, their hand receipt history and other pertinent data. The Fort Knox Training Support Center is an Army wide fabrication facility for training weapons and other devices. During the 5 years of operation at Fort Knox, KMI has initiated process improvements in the urethane casting of mock weapons. Our current production method, using machined aluminum molding and an improved urethane chemistry has yielded a 75% decrease in demold times. In addition through the Fort Knox contract, KMI was awarded an additional contract for the fabrication of 2,000 improvised exploding devices (IEDs) to be used for training purposes. One of the biggest threats to soldiers who are deployed in Iraq and Afghanistan is home-made bombs remotely detonated by

terrorists. Eighty percent of the U.S. casualties sustained in Operation Iraqi Freedom were as a result of IEDs. Even more challenging is the speed in which the terrorists adapt to new and different threats. The Army has been responding to this threat by offering more realistic training IEDs to help prepare soldiers, sailors, airmen and Marines when they go in harm's way. The simulations provide training in approaching, identifying, transiting, processing, handling and disposing of IEDs. KMI accomplished this immediate production request from the Army and delivered the requested 2,000 devices in 120 days.
